## This Weeks Topics

Here are important topics and information for everyone:

### 1) HONOR/MERIT ROLL CRITERIA

Students are placed on the High Honor Roll if they earn an academic average of 95.0% or above. Students are placed on the Honor Roll if they earn an academic average of 90.0% - 94.9%. Students receive Commendable Achievement if they earn an academic average of 85.0% - 89.9%. Any student who's course/subject grade is below 75% or receives an F/U grade (P/S or F/U graded classes), they will not be included on the above lists. This includes all classes no matter the length of the class

### 2) MIDDLE SCHOOL PROMOTION POLICY

A point system will be used to determine which students will be promoted to 9<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 7<sup>th</sup> grade.

**For 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students:** English, Social Studies, Science, Math, and Second Language are worth four (4) points each. Music, Phys. Ed., Art, Reading, Home & Careers, and Technology are worth two (2) points each.

A student earns 32 points when passing all subjects. **Students would need a minimum of 25 points to be promoted to the next grade.**

**For 6<sup>th</sup> grade students:** English, Social Studies, Science, Math, and Reading are worth four (4) points each. Health and Phys. Ed. are worth two (2) points each. Math Review A, Math Review B, General Music, Art, and Thinking Skills are worth one (1) point each. Students passing all courses would earn 28 points. **A minimum of 22 points is necessary for promotion to 7<sup>th</sup> grade.**

**FINAL COURSE GRADES** are determined by adding quarterly report card grades and final examination scores (if applicable) within individual subjects. **FINAL COURSE GRADES of 70 % and above are passing.**

### 3) PARENT CONFERENCES

We encourage communication between school personnel and members of the community we serve. Parents may make appointments for conferences with teachers, counselors or the principal by telephoning the school office from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
